

Please join in confessing the Athanasian Creed using the litany below:

Pastor: Whoever wants to be saved should above all cling to the catholic faith.

All: Whoever does not guard it whole and inviolable will doubtless perish eternally.

Pastor: Now this is the catholic faith: We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity,

Men: neither confusing the persons

Women: nor dividing the divine being.

Pastor: For the Father is one person,

Men: the Son is another,

Women: and the Spirit is still another.

Pastor: But the Deity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is one,

All: equal in glory, coeternal in majesty.

Pastor What the Father is,

Men: the Son is,

Women: and so is the Holy Spirit.

Pastor: Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son, uncreated is the Spirit.

Men: The Father is infinite; the Son is infinite; the Holy Spirit is infinite.

Women: Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Spirit:

All: and yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal; as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings; but one who is uncreated and unlimited.

Pastor: Almighty is the Father; Men: Almighty is the Son;

Women: Almighty is the Spirit;

All: And yet there are not three almighty beings, but one who is Almighty.

Pastor: Thus the Father is God;

Men: the Son is God;

Women: the Holy Spirit is God;

All: And yet there are not three gods, but one God.

Pastor: Thus the Father is Lord;

Men: the Son is Lord;

Women: the Holy Spirit is Lord:

All: And yet there are not three lords, but one Lord.

Pastor: As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord,

All: so catholic religion forbids us to say that there are three gods or lords.

Pastor: The Father was neither made nor created not begotten;

Men: the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father;

Women: the Spirit was neither made nor created but is proceeding from the Father and the Son.

All: Thus there is one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three spirits.

Pastor: And in this Trinity,

Men: no one is before or after,

Women: greater or less than the other;

All: but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal; and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three persons. Whoever wants to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.

Pastor: It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe that our Lord Jesus Christ became flesh.

All: For this is the true faith that we believe and confess, that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

Pastor: He is God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and He is man, born in the world from the being of His mother—

Women: existing fully as God, and fully as man with a rational soul and a human body:

Men: equal to the Father in divinity, subordinate to the Father in humanity.

All: although He is God and man, He is not divided, but is one Christ.

Pastor: He is united because God has taken humanity into Himself; He does not transform deity into humanity.

Women: He is completely one in the unity of His person, without confusing His natures.

Men: For as the rational soul and body are one person, so the one Christ is God and man.

All: He suffered death for our salvation.

Pastor: He descended into hell and rose again from the dead.

Women: He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

Men: He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

ALL: At His coming all people shall rise bodily to give an account of their own deeds.

Women: Those who have done good will enter eternal life,

Men: those who have done evil will enter eternal fire.

Pastor: This is the catholic faith.

All: One cannot be saved without believing this firmly and faithfully.

STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

1 KINGS 12:1-11, 16-20

King Rehoboam chooses the bravado of peers over the wisdom of elders. The nation of Israel fragments into north and south. Actions have consequences.

¹Rehoboam went to Shechem, for all Israel had come to Shechem to make him king. ²When Jeroboam son of Nebat heard of it (for he was still in Egypt, where he had fled from King Solomon), then Jeroboam returned from Egypt. ³And they sent and called him; and Jeroboam and all the assembly of Israel came and said to Rehoboam, ⁴Your father made our yoke heavy.

Now therefore lighten the hard service of your father and his heavy yoke that he placed on us, and we will serve you. ⁵He said to them, "Go away for three days, then come again to me." So the people went away.

Then King Rehoboam took counsel with the older men who had attended his father Solomon while he was still alive, saying, "How do you advise me to answer this people?" ⁷They answered him, "If you will be a servant to this people today and serve them, and speak good words to them when you answer them, then they will be your servants forever." ⁸But he disregarded the advice that the older men gave him, and consulted with the young men who had grown up with him and now attended him. ⁹He said to them, "What do you advise that we answer this people who have said to me, 'Lighten the yoke that your father put on us'?" ¹⁰The young men who had grown up with him said to him, "Thus you should say to this people who spoke to you, 'Your father made our yoke heavy, but you must lighten it for us'; thus you should say to them, 'My little finger is thicker than my father's loins. ¹¹Now, whereas my father laid on you a heavy yoke, I will add to your yoke. My father disciplined you with whips, but I will discipline you with scorpions."

¹⁶When all Israel saw that the king would not listen to them, the people answered the king,

"What share do we have in David?

We have no inheritance in the son of Jesse.

To your tents, O Israel!

Look now to your own house, O David."

So Israel went away to their tents. ¹⁷But Rehoboam reigned over the Israelites who were living in the towns of Judah. ¹⁸When King Rehoboam sent Adoram, who was taskmaster over the forced labor, all Israel stoned him to death. King Rehoboam then hurriedly mounted his chariot to flee to Jerusalem. ¹⁹So Israel has been in rebellion against the house of David to this day.

²⁰When all Israel heard that Jeroboam had returned, they sent and called him to the assembly and made him king over all Israel. There was no one who followed the house of David, except the tribe of Judah alone.

SECOND LESSON ROMANS 8:12-17

In describing the new life of faith, Paul refers to all three persons of the Trinity: the Spirit leads us to recognize that we are children of God the Father and joint heirs with Christ the Son.

¹²Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—¹³ for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

*GOSPEL JOHN 3:1-17

Those who are able may stand to honor Christ during the reading of the Gospel.

Response after announcement:

C: Glory to you, O Lord

Jesus' miracles prompt Nicodemus to visit him in secrecy. Jesus tells him about being born of the Spirit and about the Son who has been sent by God to save.

¹Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." ³Jesus answered him, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

¹⁷"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

The Athanasian Creed

The Lutheran Confessions begin with the Three Chief Symbols: the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed. These three creeds faithfully uphold the church's biblical teaching on the mystery of God and the good news of Jesus Christ. The creeds are faithful to the witness of the Bible (indeed formulated before or during the collection of the biblical canon) and in both the ancient and contemporary Church serve as measures of right-thinking and right-praise of God.

The Athanasian Creed, attributed to the teachings of the Church father St. Athanasius, describes the mystery of the Trinity. The constant repetition and strong wording in the Creed reflect its historical context. Originally this Creed was meant to correct the error of Arius and his followers. Arius taught that the Son was not equal to the Father but instead an exalted being. The truth passed on in the Bible and this Creed is that Jesus is both God and Man.

If Jesus is Lord, then how does Jesus relate to the Father and the Spirit? The consensus of the Church is the confession of Trinity, the Three who are One, explain how Jesus is Lord. Only if Jesus is Lord is ultimate salvation from sin, death, and devil possible. Only if the Holy Spirit guides and sanctifies us as we follow Jesus the Son to the glory of the Father is holy living possible. In the Name of Father, +Son, and Spirit we receive baptism, communion, forgiveness, strength for our journey and ultimately the joy of resurrection life.

Our Faith: Trinitarian Markers

The **sign of the holy cross**—a prayer action using three fingers, touching our forehead, down to our heart, and to the left and right shoulders—may be done before and after prayers. **Luther** specifically taught the sign for morning and evening prayer in the *Small Catechism*.

In the Name of the Father +the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

When **Patrick** spread the **good news of Jesus** to the Irish he explained the Trinity using the clover. His *Breastplate* begins: I bind unto myself today the strong name of the Trinity!

As the practice of praying the **Psalter** grew in the early Church (prayer book of David and of our Lord Jesus) the **Gloria Patri** became a way of concluding each psalm:

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.
