STORY OF SALVATION LESSON

1 KINGS 19: 1-18

In the northern kingdom of Israel, the Prophet Elijah battles false religion. A call for his assassination leads to the LORD coming to His prophet as the still, small voice.

¹Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. ²Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, "So may the gods do to me, and more also, if I do not make your life like the life of one of them by this time tomorrow." ³Then he was afraid; he got up and fled for his life, and came to Beer-sheba, which belongs to Judah; he left his servant there.

⁴But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a

solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." ⁵Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. ⁷The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." ⁸He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God. ⁹At that place he came to a cave, and spent the night there.

Then the word of the LORD came to him, saying, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁰He answered, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away."

¹¹He said, "Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by." Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; ¹²and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. ¹³When Elijah heard it. he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" ¹⁴He answered, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away." ¹⁵Then the LORD said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. 16 Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷Whoever escapes from the sword of Hazael, Jehu shall kill; and whoever escapes from the sword of Jehu, Elisha shall kill. ¹⁸Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him."

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SECOND LESSON

2 CORINTHIANS 4:5-12

When we carry out God's ministry we do so not for our glory but for the sake of Jesus Christ whom we proclaim as Lord. The power for ministry comes from God, not us, so that we persevere no matter what, trusting in God's power and promises at work through us.

⁵We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not


crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. ¹¹For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. ¹²So death is at work in us, but life in you.

Jesus challenges the prevailing interpretation of what is lawful on the sabbath and tells his critics that the sabbath was made for humankind, not the other way around. Healing the man with the withered hand is work that cannot wait until the next day.

²³One sabbath [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. ²⁴The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" ²⁵And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? ²⁶He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." ²⁷Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; ²⁸so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath."

^{3:1}Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. ²They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him.

³And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." ⁴Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. ⁵He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. ⁶The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.


On the Journey of the Prophet Elijah Right Sabbath Keeping

The Law is an aspect in the Word that shows our brokenness: I do not really rest and worship weekly.

The Gospel is an aspect of God's Word that comforts and saves us in Christ: Jesus calls us to receive the gifts of rest, worship, and being made whole in Him.

So What? Day of Preparation—yes! One must prepare to rest, right? Six days work to God's glory and on the seventh day (the Lord's Day recalling Jesus' resurrection) rest and worship.

Journey of the Prophet Elijah The Call

The Prophet Elijah, whose name means "My God is the LORD" was called to prophesy in the northern kingdom of Israel. He was called to denounce the worship of the false god, Baal, and to call Israel back to worship the LORD. Living in the wilderness and dressed in a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt (2 Kings 1:8) Elijah was a strong figure that stood up to King Ahab and Queen Jezebel.

What was Baal worship?

Baal was a Canaanite fertility god. Worship of Baal was present even in the days of Moses and Joshua. Some depictions show Baal as a god of the storm with the horn of a bull and a thunderbolt for a spear. Baal was thought to be responsible for the fertility of the fields and for the rains bringing new life. The worship of Baal included the following. Ritual dances were conducted, a kind of limping around an altar dedicated to Baal (1 Kings 18:26). Those worshipping would cut themselves and drop blood on the ground thinking that would cause Baal to make the ground fertile (1 Kings 18:28). Those worshipping would engage in ritual prostitution with "sacred" prostitutes in orgies out in the fields and under trees believing that Baal would then cause the land and animals to be fertile (Amos 2:7-8). The worshipers would burn a lot of incense (Jeremiah 7:9). Like with the worship of Molech – there may have been child sacrifice.

The Drought and Famine

The Prophet Elijah announced a drought was coming upon the northern kingdom. At first, he lived a solitary existence hidden near the brook Cherith fed by the ravens sent by the LORD (1 Kings 17:1-6). As the brook dried up, the LORD then sent him to live with a widow of Zarephath. There the LORD provided an unending supply of flour and oil to their household and there He raised the widow's son after death (1 Kings 17:8-24). Many faithful people of the LORD were murdered by Ahab and Jezebel. Some of His people were saved by the work of Obadiah, who was over Ahab's household (1 Kings 18:3).

Battle with the Prophets of Baal

In the third year of the drought, Elijah challenged King Ahab and the many prophets of Baal to a contest. Which sacrifice would be accepted? The LORD chose to act receiving Elijah's prayer and sending fire down from the skies (1 Kings 18:35). When the people saw it, many returned to the LORD. Many prophets of Baal were slaughtered. After this victory, the Prophet Elijah announced the end of the drought and rains again fell upon the dry earth.

The Still, Small Voice

Queen Jezebel did not repent. Instead, she sent out a hit squad to kill the Prophet Elijah. Alone, afraid and thinking his nation lost, Elijah fled to Horeb, the mount of God and hid in a cave. He prayed for the LORD to let him die (1 Kings 19:4). Instead, the LORD reveals Himself in the still, small voice, the whisper (1 Kings 19:12) and calls the Prophet to return to action anointing future leaders who would be instrumental in changing Israel's future.

Naboth's Vineyard

The disregard for private property and the covetousness of King Ahab led to the seizure of Naboth's vineyard. Queen Jezebel conspired against the righteous Naboth arranging his murder. The Prophet Elijah confronts the king and announces the future disasters that were to come for the evil rulers (1 Kings 21).

The Assumption of Elijah

At the end of his prophetic work, Elijah was taken up into heaven by the whirlwind/chariots of fire (2 Kings 2:11). Elijah and the antediluvian Enoch (Genesis 5:24) are the only two people taken directly into heaven without dying.

The Spirit of Elijah

Much later in the days of the 2nd Temple of Jerusalem, the Prophet Malachi proclaimed that Elijah would return before the coming of the Messiah (Malachi 4:5-6). This prophecy was fulfilled in the prophetic work of John the Baptist preparing the way for our Lord Jesus Christ (Matthew 11:14). The last appearance of Elijah in the Bible is when he comes along with Moses to speak to Jesus at His Transfiguration (Mark 9).

So What? Plain Sense Meanings: There are Ahabs and Jezebels to this day. Persevere and be faithful when times are evil. Elijah trusted the LORD to provide. The LORD did in surprising ways (re: ravens, the widow, angels). The suffering church, then and now, is to take up our cross and follow Jesus always. This is not our home. Look forward and upward to our coming heavenly home in Christ.
