#### From the Pastor...

Why the Historic Liturgy?

I used to think that there are simply different worship styles. Contemporary. Traditional. Lutheridge camp. High liturgy. In your Christian freedom, you like what you like and go with it, right? Maybe as a church we can even have the best of both ways of praising God?

Then in daily prayer studying Bonhoeffer, Luther, and the old Common Service Book for our 100<sup>th</sup> Sanctuary celebration I began to wrestle with this quote:

The richness of the Word of God ought to determine our prayer, not the poverty of our heart. From **Psalms – The Prayerbook of the Bible**, Bonhoeffer.

Is it not true that the Holy Spirit has passed down to us a biblical liturgy now used over the millennia in many and various places of the Christian Church? That liturgy has had to be reformed from time to time. I did mention Luther, right? The music used, the translations used may be many and varied. Nevertheless, these are biblical texts, Psalms, Canticles, the Word of God sung are a gift from Tabernacle to Temple to Church to us here and now.

One may continue to think it is just a matter of style to choose what you want. But to do so ignores the concrete gifts of the Word for us. I have changed. I am determined to share with Lutheran Chapel the best of the historic liturgy and to engage the whole Bible Sunday by Sunday. If you want rock bands and whatever is popular now that is not hard to find. But let us not rob ourselves of the ancient praise, the wisdom of the ages and the gifts of Jesus' Word and Sacrament given to His people, to all who will gather. So, this summer a simpler liturgy of Antecommunion and Holy Communion will be kept Sunday by Sunday. Vespers will be kept Wednesday by Wednesday. Finally, the Bible in a Year discipline will be printed to for our daily prayers that we may read "the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:26-27) for ourselves. Let us receive the gifts of God together.

#### HOLY ANGELS

July's love offering will be sent to Holy Angels. This ministry was founded in 1955 by the Sisters of Mercy and continues today to provide the highest quality programs and services for children and adults with varying degrees of mental retardation; some of whom have physical disabilities, and are medically fragile requiring specialized care. Programs provided to the residents include residential services, special education, medical services, creative arts therapy, social work, habilitation services, nutrition, recreation, vocational training, and opportunities for spiritual growth. The support and donations given to this ministry, offers families the peace of heart and mind in knowing that their special child is receiving the highest quality of compassionate care and a loving home.

Holy Angels currently serves more than 80 children and adults in the residence program. Some of the residents receive vocational training and enjoy employment at Cherubs Café and Cotton Candy Factory – two small businesses established by Holy Angels in Downtown Belmont. Also, Spruced Goose in McAdenville offers employment to Holy Angel residents. Bliss Gallery was established to offer persons who are differently able the opportunity to share creative abilities and showcase their art alongside the works of guest artists.

Holy Angels will soon begin a \$20 million expansion to add three new six-room homes, and a community center which includes a wheelchair accessible pool, and a learning center. The new rooms will have specialty medical equipment and oxygen available for the medically fragile residents.

Like the individuals that depend on their care, Holy Angels, depends on the support of others to provide the highest quality of care. All contributions are welcomed from each individual and from corporate donations. Holy Angels continues to strive to provide loving care and is committed to helping and challenging residents to reach their highest potential. At Holy Angels, it is about little miracles. 
