Some reflections on the Great Commandment our Lord Jesus gives us as we look to *Rally Day* **2024** on **September 22**. Don't miss the gift of God's Word for you!

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. Mark 12:30

• Loving with all the heart

The heart is the center of personhood and will. In Jesus, the love of God for me is made known and His will to save me is made known on the Cross. What is the focus of my will? How will I love God today?

• Loving with all the soul

The soul is our breath and being. The Holy Spirit is given to us in our baptism that we may belong to Him and abide with Him. What is the focus of my soul? How will I abide in Him today breath by breath, aware of Him in me and in the midst of His people?

Loving with all the mind

The mind is our awareness and understanding. In Jesus, the Word of God is given that we may grow in understanding "thy Word is lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path" (re: Psalm 119:105). What is God's Word saying to me? Hearing the gift of His Word, how will I now live?

• Loving with all strength

The strength is our energy and power to act. God gave strength to David to slay Goliath and God gave the drive to Paul to share the Gospel with the Gentiles. What is the focus of my strength? What will I do now to glorify God?



LUTHERAN CHAPEL CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MINUTES JULY 28, 2024

Council made decisions and discussed the following:

- A financial report as of June 30, 2024 was presented and although we were over budget \$2,400 for the month, we are still under budget for the year.
- A motion was made and unanimously passed for the \$500 scholarship to Lenoir Rhyne be continued for the upcoming school year.
- Due to the closing of the Salvation Army, council approved the gifts for the homeless bags.
- There was discussion to invite the chairpersons of our Outreach team to serve on the Emergency Family Fund for transparency around those we help. Pastor will reach out to said chairpersons.
- Rally Day was set for September 22, 2024.
- The Organist Search Committee reported to have a promising candidate that they would like to move forward with pending a meeting with Kathie and the absent committee members. A motion was made and unanimously approved to move forward.
- The Endowment Committee is in need of two members to replace Ken Obenauf and Nancy Witman.
- Church Mutual is not renewing churches over 20 years. We are getting quotes from five companies with Sovereign Insurance Group who specializes in churches and educational facilities
- Our Administrative Assistant Becky Shaw has resigned. Kim has agreed to fill in until a replacement has been has been found.
- James Hovis presented a list from the Property Committee of items that need to be dealt with. The furnace in the parsonage needs to be updated/replaced. Approval was given by council to repair leak in the Family Life Center. Rain gutters are currently being repaired. James advised that we have \$25,000 in the annual budget for maintenance. Payment for the flat roof will come from the Lutheran Chapel Endowment Fund.
- The Communications Committee reported that the calendar on the website has been updated. Also, Facebook no longer allows group sharing so we cannot stream to Facebook.

The next full council meeting is scheduled for September 15, 2024.

SEPTEMBER LOVE OFFERING ~ HOUSE OF MERCY

Our love offering for **September** will be given to the House of Mercy. The mission of House of Mercy is to provide care to persons living with advanced AIDS. This ministry cares and provides housing arrangements for those who cannot afford the costs. An environment of complete acceptance and love is provided in a home-like setting. House of Mercy provides a caring structure of regular meals, scheduled medical appointments, and medicines. The program offers individuals the opportunity to deal with spiritual issues and encourages family reconciliation when families are in disarray.

2024 marks the House of Mercy's 33rd year of service for persons living with AIDS. Nearly 350 persons have made House of Mercy their home since 1991. Without our donations, this ministry could not continue to exist because 80% of their operating budget comes from contributions.


